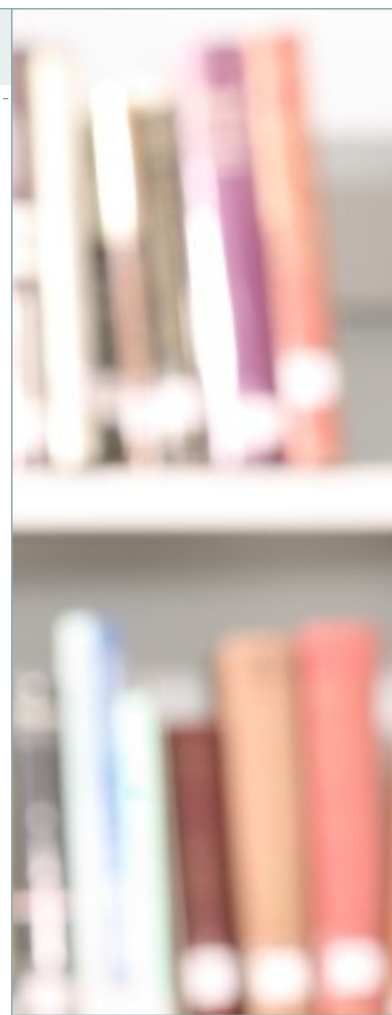

I enjoy my job as treasurer and am honored to work with such an awesome group of educators!

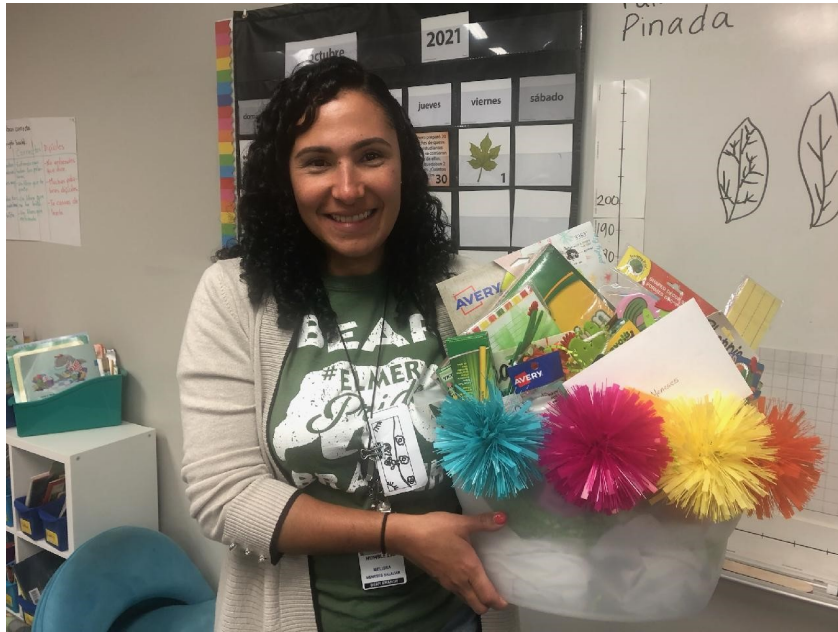

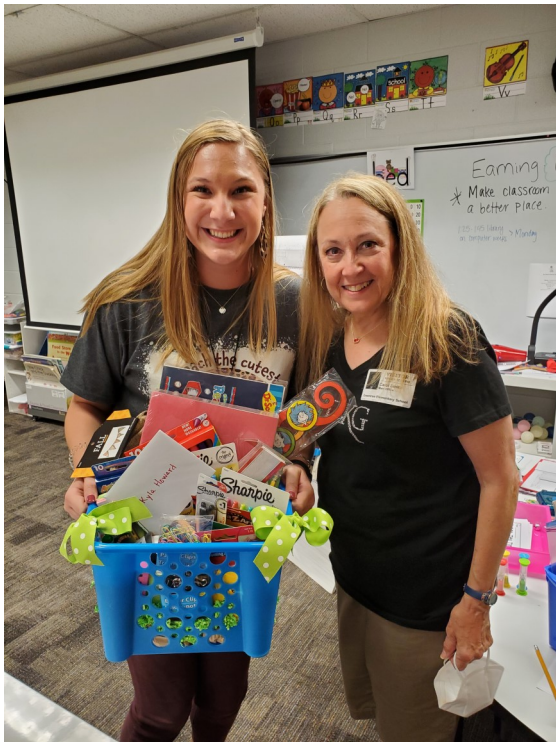

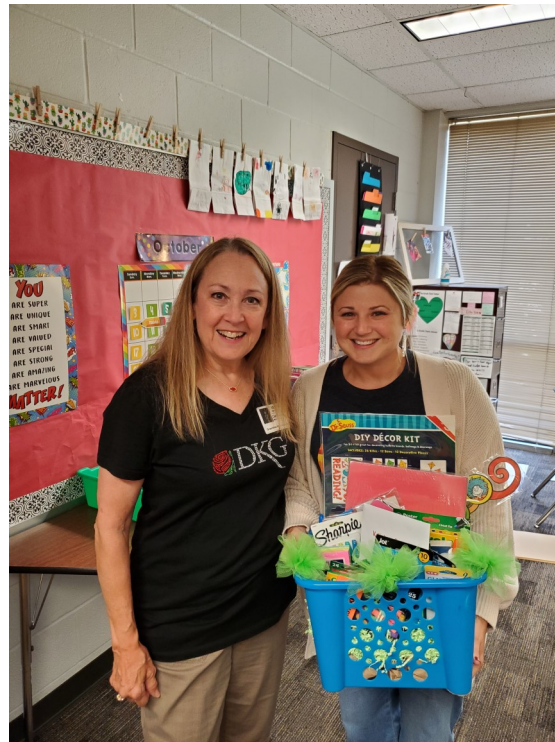

Updates on our sisters waging war on cancer:

Holli Sadler - She got her final round of Chemo in August, and her scans came back with great news. Surgery on August 18th followed by Radiation 5 days/week for 7 week as soon as she could raise her arms above her head. Well, she developed lymphedema in her chest wall that required a drain to get rid of the fluid. That has postponed her Radiation until that's under control. She's in a holding pattern now. Gift cards for food or grocery would be a huge blessing as her husband is responsible for meals. She appreciates the cards and encouraging words she's already received from us! Bonnie Longnion was able to attend our October 29th meeting via Zoom! As of today (11/5), she has 5 more radiation treatments to go, so Monday - Friday 11/8 - 11/12. She'll start back on IV infusions for 3-6 months in December to try to get any microscopic cancer cells in her blood or lymph nodes to try to get them before they start a new tumor somewhere. Maybe in early summer she'll get to take a leap of faith and stop the treatment to see if it worked.
