Notes from the Treasurer Rhian Webb

• Just an update on our fundraising and donations for the 2018/2019 year. We have raised a total of \$4274.50 which is amazing! The expenses incurred were a total of \$858.87 so that leaves us with a fundraising balance of \$3415.63. This will be spent as follows:
