"The Door" and FamilyTime Crisis & Counseling Center A Treasured Part of the Humble Community

At the FamilyTime Crisis & Counseling Center's Purple Ribbon Luncheon October 9th, their remarkable 2014 service statistics were printed in the program: 733 – Shelter Occupancy; 49 – Sexual assault victims accompanied to local hospitals for treatment; 4,355 – Sessions of free counseling provided to victims of abuse and other violent crimes; 2,055 – Sessions of low-cost counseling provided to non-victims; 16,377 – Calls answered on the 24-hour helpline; 1,484 – Total number of unduplicated calls assisted with victim services; 1,117 – Volunteers who donated their time to FamilyTime; 21,808 – Hours of volunteer assistance donated to FamilyTime; 240 – Educational presentations and training sessions provided to the community. "The Door" is FamilyTime's shelter and houses up to 38 victims of abuse and their children in a safe and nurturing environment. The women and children receive meals, counseling, and other needed services in preparation for transition to a more permanent and stable environment. Opened in 1996, "The Door" continues to be the only all-inclusive shelter and crisis center in Northeast Harris County serving victims of domestic violence and their children. Please consider donating diapers, baby shampoo, baby wipes, diaper rash ointment, baby lotion, baby formula, paper towels, toilet tissue, twin-size bed linens, pillows, blankets, towels (bath, kitchen, & hand), brooms & dustpans, mops & mop heads, household cleaning products, liquid laundry detergent & bleach, garbage bags, ladies underwear, ladies bras, girls underwear, boys underwear, adult & children pain relievers, adult & children cough & cold medicine, Neosporin, band-aids, adult & children's benadryl, rubbing alcohol, hydrogen peroxide, orajel, shampoo & conditioner, deodorant, make-up, hair brushes & accessories, body lotion, toothpaste & toothbrushes, mouthwash & dental floss, maxi pads & tampons, or school supplies. Your January donation of a ladies purse along with any of these items will be much appreciated!
