Also, our members will generously donate the much needed food items for the local H.A.A.M. food pantry and toys for HAAM's Empty Stocking Drive and Angel Tree to be delivered the next morning.

Serving our Community

Join us on December 3 in collecting food, toys and monetary donations for HAAM to serve the community's needs during the upcoming **Season of Sharing**. Why should you donate to this project? Those who benefit are the working poor in our own community, who are living in crisis or poverty and are trying to make ends meet. Although collecting and distributing <u>food for needy families</u> is something HAAM does year round, this time of year the need is especially great. Most needed are items such as stuffing mix, canned green beans, canned sweet corn, instant potatoes, Jiffy cornbread mix, turkey gravy (can or mix), canned fruit, dry beans and brownie mix. In lieu of goods, HAAM is also accepting monetary donations. A donation of \$30 will feed one family.

Along with the food items we are also holding a <u>toy collection drive</u> for HAAM. Toys for children of all ages and interests are hoped for, including <u>gift cards</u> for teenagers in need. The toys and gifts are distributed through a HAAM toy store, where parents are able to come and select gifts for their children. The families who benefit from the Empty Stocking Toy Drive are very appreciative. Toys will be distributed Dec.12, 13, 15 and 16. In addition to physical toys, monetary donations are accepted. For those who may wish to donate specific items for children, the HAAM Angel Tree will open in Deerbrook Mall on the Friday after Thanksgiving and will run until Dec. 15. The Angel Tree is decorated with angel tags, each one including the name, age, gender, wish list items and a specific code number for a HAAM recipient. Donors can select a tag, purchase a gift and return it unwrapped with the coded tag to Deerbrook Mall.

HAAM is a faith-based organization that helps community residents in crisis by providing essential resources to move towards self-sufficiency. In 2013, HAAM holiday care packages went out to 8,424 individuals and over 6,000 gifts were distributed. The Seasons of Sharing food and toy drives make it possible for HAAM to keep doing the good work that they do.
