We had the opportunity to purchase a signed copy of her most recent book *Becoming a Woman of Purpose*. Many of us will be giving signed copies of her book for Christmas gifts! Thank you, Dottie Willner, for pulling some strings to get her to come speak to us!

Our Business:

- Members were asked to Recommend/Nominate New Members for the October meeting. The membership form can be found on the Lambda Delta website and a copy will also be coming to you via email.
- Cheryl Moore presented proposed Chapter Rules changes, which Carol will be emailing to all members. Please read over these so we can discuss them and vote on them in the October meeting. Cheryl met with Chris Morrison (from the State Committee) at the Area 18 Fall Workshop to get official perusal and approval, making certain we are in compliance with recent changes in the State and International Rules.

This would include poems, cartoons, articles, pictures.... anything that is not original. Diane Moose has put an article on the Alpha State Website's front page entitled "What Every Discerning DKG Editor and Webmaster Needs to Know." Neither the State nor the International organization can be held liable if a chapter gets sued for infringement on intellectual property.
